Ruth is currently a family nurse practitioner in an ER. She has been an RN for over 30 years, and a forensic nurse since 1999. Ruth has a vision of augmenting communication between the healthcare and legal communities to improve their response to victims of violence.

Over the span of her career, Ruth has been active in county, state, and national efforts addressing violence in our communities and has appeared as an expert witness in the areas of Domestic Violence, Sexual Assault and Strangulation.

Ruth initiated and directed a Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner program for seven years. She is an active member of the Ohio Chapter of the International Association of Forensic Nurses, and is currently the immediate Past President. She is also a member of the Central Ohio Rescue & Restore Coalition, the Ohio Sexual Assault Task Force, the Ohio Alliance to End Sexual Violence steering committee, the American Academy of Nurse Practitioners, the Ohio Association of Advanced Practice Nurses, and the Delaware County Medical Reserve Corps.

Among her other accomplishments, Ruth has authored "Manual and Ligature Strangulation" for On the Edge, and has presented at the IAFN's Scientific Assembly. She has provided education on sexual assault, domestic violence and strangulation to nurses, physicians, law enforcement, social workers, parents, grand juries, and others.

During the summer of 2008, Ruth traveled to Huanuco, Peru at the special request of the International Justice Mission to provide education on sexual assault evidence collection to community leaders in health care and law enforcement. In 2009 she will return to assist the district attorney in forming a child sexual abuse unit, and provide further education for forensic physicians to improve sexual assault exams.
